Take in old, unused Rx for proper disposal

In honor of Earth Day on April 22nd get your old, unused medications properly disposed of! The Texas Tech University School of Pharmacy in conjunction with the Amarillo Police Department will accept medications for no question disposal. This will help alleviate drugs from ending up in the wrong hands. It also prevents the meds from getting flushed down toilets and risk putting our valuable water supply at risk. All collected medication is incinerated properly.

Drop off prescription medications, samples, non-prescription medications, vitamins, supplements, pet medications, nebulizer solutions during the event. Please do <u>not</u> bring IV fluid bags, oxygen tanks, nebulizer or glucometer machines. Just leave the medication in the original packaging and drop-off from 10 am to 2 pm.



If you miss this opportunity, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) is holding their National Take Back Initiative on April 29th. Pills and patches can be dropped off at either the Potter County Sheriff's Office (608 S Pierce) or the Randall County Sheriff's Office (9100 South Georgia, Jail Entrance). Pills, vitamins, supplements and patches will be accepted; please no liquids, needles or sharps at these locations.
